Docked is about a hospital ship in Africa and the diverse group of people from all over the world who put their lives on hold to volunteer on a ship that is essentially a floating village.

WHAT IS THE SHOW?

It's a hospital drama, a situational comedy, a travel show and more. Though the hospital is the heart of the ship, it takes many volunteers to keep the ship afloat. There are teachers (for the children of families), cooks, engineers, a hairdresser — this show is *character-driven*. Docked will dive into the histories of the characters and explore the choices that led to their current conflicts and circumstances, much like other great character dramas *This Is Us* and *Orange Is The New Black*.

Our guide to the ship is Cameron Clark, a young Canadian who comes to film a documentary and ends up staying for longer than she intended.

WILL IT FLOAT?

A.K.A. Does it have longevity? Yes, it does.

Because it takes place on a ship, the entire show can set sail and take place in different countries. Season one takes place in Madagascar, but season two could be any coastal African country. Plus, the international crew can rotate endlessly.

Docked is, at heart, a show about a floating village, a microcosm of the world, positioned minutes away from the radically different continent of Africa. Any story that could be told in a small town could be told here, but with the added pressure of a confined, high-pressure space.

Finally, it's based on true events. For two years I lived on a very similar ship off the coast of Africa. Much like Cameron, I ended up staying for longer than I intended. There are countless stories I can't wait to tell.
